<p>The festival is Aug 4th, and one of the oldest festivals in Seattle. It had been run by the chamber of commerce. Bob is running it now. 125th Street will be closed down to connect the area in front of the library for a food rodeo, and a salmon bake. There will also be a kids area, and a car show. The festival is only on Saturday. There will also be a salmon bake on Friday.</p>		

There will be a new “Big Truck Explorer Zone” – Metro, Fire, Sheriff, police.
In the new skate park there will be a new Teen Zone combining music and skating.
Needs volunteer support to make it all happen.
Fred Meyer is sponsoring the parade. BECU and Homestreet bank are sponsoring.
HIP is providing free meals for families who can't afford the salmon bake or food truck rodeo.
Help needed: Managing excel, making phone calls, organizing volunteers, technical help, equipment help, greeters at entrances.
For community service organizations, the booth fees can be reduced or waived, but please have something welcoming, interactive, and participatory.

Feeding Lake City area people: reports by two of our member organizations

North Helpline & Hunger Intervention Program

North Helpline
Foodbank program and financial assistance program
In 2017, saw an 11% increase in people getting assistance, and 11.5% increase in pounds of food distributed.
Expanded to take over the Volunteer Services of America facility in Bitterlake. 40% increase in zipcode 98133.
Over 60% of the clients in lake city are seniors living on fixed income.
58% of food comes from grocery rescue program. Volunteers pick up from area grocery stores.
To meet the needs, need to shift to buying more food, due to Sam's Club no longer donating food.
Partnerships with p-patches.
Added another store to add back about half of the volume of food that was lost from Sam's Club.
Looking to increase food purchase to \$100,000/yr to make up the gap and improve the nutrition mix.
They also have a home delivery service every other week.

Emergency services in 2017

In Feb this year, they were out of their allotted funds by the 7th of the month.
It is more cost efficient to keep people from being kicked out onto the streets than to try to get them off of the streets and into housing.
1687 volunteers who worked 36,446 hours in 2017. They speak over 52 languages, and many volunteers are also receiving services.

Also partnered with Valley City Mental Health services (upstairs)

Senior meal program at the community center – Mondays and Wednesdays. This also provides services for people who are not seniors ... about 20% aren't seniors. Backpack program for kids – likely adding Northgate Elementary and Sacajawea Elementary

Educational program – cooking curriculum, 6 week course on nutritional cooking, smart shopping, food budget

In school – fun night cooking night events

Targeted classes for diet needs – low sodium, etc.

Food Security = everyone has food

Food community = Community has control over production and consumption of food

Food Justice = Connection of multiple systems that supports food (environment, sustainability, fair wages, etc.)

This year, expanding the senior program from 2 days to 3 days, and starting an East African meal

This summer, at the farmers market, there will be a once a month cooking demo

In Olympic Hills, 3/4th of the kids are on free and reduced lunch, and there is no stigma to kids who get the backpacks.
